Elevation and Azimuth



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X: Modulator at Gregory, Rotating Analyzer (Az+El) at Coudé



This is the baseline design. Analyzer must rotate to compensate for elevation and azimuth rotations. Note significant X_{23} and X_{32} variations with hour angle. These are about 0.01 of diagonal elements. Rotation to correct X matrix is not the same needed to compensate image rotation. Calibration vs. elevation could be used to model this effect at all elevations.

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X: Modulator at Gregory, Image rotation correction at Coudé



Analyzer rotates along with coudé to correct for image rotation (elevation). Note significant X_{41} variations with hour angle. These are about 0.1 of intensity. Calibration vs. azimuth could be used to model this effect at all azimuths.

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With modulator immediately followed by analyzer, there is no change in the X matrix due to azimuth and elevation changes. Image rotation can be corrected at Coudé. Dual beam analyzer at Gregory, upstream of AO system, will probably not work.

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X Matrix: Modulator @ Gregory/AO/Coude, Analyzer @ Coudé



X matrix vs hour angle for modulator at **Gregory**, **AO**, and **Coudé** and analyzer (rotating to correct Az and El) at Coudé. X_{11} shows transmission following modulator. All other elements normalized to X_{11} . Only modulator at **Gregory** changes significantly over the day.

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X: Modulator conclusions

•Coordinate transformations between modulator and analyzer introduce cross talk

•With modulator at Gregory and analyzer at Coudé, X_{23}/X_{22} varies by 0.01 over a day. X matrix could be calibrated vs. elevation.

•Very small changes in X over a day with modulator at AO or Coudé and analyzer at Coudé.

•Very small changes in X over a day with modulator *and* analyzer at Gregory.



Telescope matrix vs hour angle for optics preceding modulator at Gregory, AO (middle curves), and Coudé. X_{11} shows transmission preceding modulator. All other elements normalized to X_{11} . Only modulator at Gregory location (top blue curve) is constant over the day.

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Telescope Matrix Conclusions

•To reduce magnitude and eliminate diurnal variations, locate modulator as close to the front of the telescope as possible

•Telescope polarization 'constant' if modulator is at Gregory

•Diurnal variation in telescope polarization is added if modulator is moved to AO. 0.05 for T_{23}/T_{22}

•Diurnal variation in telescope polarization is even larger with modulator at Coudé. $0.15 T_{23}/T_{22}$

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Dual Beam Issues

•For an **Az/El** mount, rotation required for the analyzer is not the same rotation required to correct image rotation thus complicating dual beam polarimetry

•Use equatorial mount

Place modulator and analyzer after image rotation

•Correct before analyzer with half wave plate

Allow X matrix to vary over the day

•Dual beams cannot be sent to the AO, therefore only single beam polarimetery is possible with the modulator ahead of AO.

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What options are left?

•*High Polarimetric Precision*: Build a fast C3Po (Charge Caching CMOS Photodetector). Operate in single beam mode with a rapid modulation and fixed analyzer at Gregory. At Gregory, telescope matrix magnitude is minimized and elements are constant. (think ZIMPOL)

•*High Versatility*: Use conventional detectors. Locate modulator and dual beam analyzer after image rotation correction (at Coudé). Calibrate M3 through M6 vs. Elevation and Azimuth, using calibration unit at Gregory, leaving only fixed M1 and M2 to model (much better than DST). (think DLSP)
