Turret at Gregorian Focus

• Why

- Various alignment masks are needed to set up post focus optics
- We don't know what other gregorian focus optics might be needed in the future
- Positions
 - ★ Clear
 - \star Iris
 - ★ Resolution target
 - \star Grid
 - 🖈 User 1
 - ★ User 2
 - \star ... User N



Modulator turret before Gregorian Focus

- Why
 - * No single modulator meets all requirements
 - We don't know what other polarization modulators might be needed in the future
- Positions
 - ★ Clear
 - * Rotating achromatic retarder
 - ✤ Pockel's cell
 - ★ Interchangeable LCs
 - ★ IR mesh polarizers
 - 🖈 User 1
 - ★ User 2
 - \star ... User N



Calibration station before modulator turret

- Why
 - ★ Polarimeter response matrix determination requires measurement of known input polarization.
- Positions
 - Rotatable and retractable achromatic linear polarizer (Versalight)
 - Rotatable and retractable retarder (achromatic crystal combination) following linear polarizer
 - ★ IR mesh polarizers
 - 🖈 User 1
 - ★ User 2
 - \star ... User N



Modulator Options

- Rotating achromatic retrder
- Pockel's cells
- Ferroelectric liquid crystals
- Nematic liquid cystals



Rotating Achromatic Retarder

- Use
 - * Only identified modulator for all visible/NIR wavelengths
 - * Simultaneous observations at multiple wavelengths
- Features
 - * Multi-crystalline achromat, Panchratnam or both
 - ★ Rotation: DC to ~1kHz/16
 - ★ Retardance: 126°±15° 300nm to 1600nm
 - ★ Balanced modulation not possible
 - ★ Mechanically complex
- Action items (if planned for first light)
 - Model performance with realistic residual image motion and telescope polarization model
 - ★ Refine optical design



Pockel's Cell

- Use
 - * High modulation rate
 - * 300nm to 400nm candidate
- Features
 - ★ Balanced modulation at one wavelength at a time
 - ★ Hz to kHz modulation rate
 - * Shortest wavelength depends upon electrodes
 - ★ Longest wavelength depends upon voltage and number of cells used.
- Action items (if planned for first light)
 - * Research program to develop UV transmitting electrodes
 - * Explore availability of high purity KD*P



Ferroelectric Liquid Crystal

- Use
 - Optimum modulation at design wavelength between 420nm to 1800nm
- Features
 - ★ Balanced modulation possible
 - ★ Optimum for fabrication wavelength only
 - ★ DC to kHz modulation rate
 - ★ Shortest wavelength depends upon electrodes, but LC is damaged <350nm.</p>
 - * Longest wavelength depends upon LC thickness
 - * 'Achromatic' FLC has been demonstrated by Gandorfer
- Action Items (if planned for first light)
 - * Explore achromatic designs further



Nematic Liquid Crystal (LCVR)

- Use
 - * Quick tunability and optimum modulation 420nm to 1800nm.
- Features
 - ★ Balanced modulation possible
 - ★ Tunable to a range of wavelengths
 - ★ DC to 10s Hz modulation rate
 - ★ Shortest wavelength depends upon electrodes, but LC is damaged <350nm.</p>
 - * Longest wavelength depends upon LC thickness
- Action items (if planned for first light)
 - ★ Explore electrodes for 350nm to 420nm
 - * Evaluate response vs. thickness and temperature



Modulator Comparison





*Could use FLC at polarization analyzer to increase effective rate



Modulator: Recommendation for First Light

- Modulator Turret
 - * *At least* 6 positions (rotating retarder, clear,LCvis, LCir, Far IR modulator, and user slot)
 - * Standard mechanical mounts with drive and status connections
- Rotating retarder modulator
 Most general polarization modulator
 Only modulator capable of full wavelength range
- LCVR modulators
 - * One optimized for visible
 - * One optimized for IR
