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$$\begin{aligned} & \frac{d\vec{L}}{dt} = \frac{d}{dt}(\vec{r} \times \vec{p}) = \frac{d\vec{r}}{dt} \times \vec{p} + \vec{r} \times \frac{d\vec{p}}{dt} = \vec{v} \times \vec{p} + \vec{r} \times \vec{F} = 0! \\ & dA = dr(r \ d\theta) = r \ dr \ d\theta = \frac{1}{2}r^2 \ d\theta \Rightarrow \frac{dA}{dt} = \frac{1}{2}r^2 \frac{d\theta}{dt} \\ & \vec{v} = \vec{v}_r + \vec{v}_\theta = \frac{dr}{dt}\hat{r} + r \frac{d\theta}{dt}\hat{\theta} \Rightarrow \frac{dA}{dt} = \frac{1}{2}rv_\theta \\ & rv_\theta = |\vec{r} \times \vec{v}| = \left|\frac{\vec{L}}{\mu}\right| = \frac{L}{\mu} \Rightarrow \frac{dA}{dt} = \frac{1}{2}\frac{L}{\mu} \end{aligned}$$
The time rate of change of the area swept out by a line constant.
