□ Vertical rms velocity \approx 60 m/s

 Motion towards boundaries of supergranular cells 	
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Supergranulation

- □ Spectroscopically discovered by Hart (1956)
- □ Autocorellation function of velocity fluctuations shows a secondary maimum at $d \approx 26,000$ km
- Doppler spectroheliograms (Leighton et al. 1962)
- □ Cell diameter ≈ 16,000 km, mean spacing between cell centers ≈ 30,000 km, and life-time ≈ 1 day
- □ Flow is almost invisible in Doppler maps at disk center ⇒ predominantly horizontal flow
- □ Horizontal velocity 300-500 m/s from LCT
- $\hfill\square$ Vertical velocities: central upflow \approx 60 m/s and peripheral downflow \approx 100 m/s
- Downdrafts coincide with vertices of the supergranular network
- Supergranular boundaries coincide with the chromospheric emission network
- □ Rossby number (vortex-type velocity): $Ro = u / (2\Omega) = 10$ with l = 10,000 km, u = 500 m/s, and $\Omega = 3$ µHz

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
